Right royal price

A small bracket clock dating from the time of King Charles II of England has set a New Zealand record price for a table clock at an auction in Auckland.

The clock fetched \$23,500 at the auction conducted by John Cordy Ltd.

It was part of a collection of the late William Angus, former honorary horologist at the Auckland War Memorial Museum.

Auctioneer Mr John Maconie said the offering attracted a number of bids from Australia and Britain but most of the collection went to New Zealand buyers.
